## **Leadership Letter**

Perhaps the month that includes giving thanks for all we have is a great time to talk about all that we, as a congregation, have to celebrate and look forward to—especially since it hasn't been that long since we were worrying about fundamental things, like where to congregate! Autumn has been very good to us. We are back in the Grange, which is safer and spiffier than ever. And we've begun to look at our options for a new minister. We held a Town Hall meeting to begin talking about those options, and it was great to see so many of you there, and asking questions. Let me give you a little update about our progress since then.

Your Board of Trustees is moving forward with contracting the Rev. Ken Jones as an interim minister. He will be visiting us for a service next month, and he will meet with a team to talk about contract specifics. I think the Rev. Jones will be a great help to us as we move toward finding a longer-term minister. I understand many of you have expressed the hope we could secure the Rev. Susan Maginn as an interim, and I agree that she is a wonderful presence. However, she is currently working only as a pulpit supply minister. I also believe she has not had the training in interim ministry that the Rev. Jones has had, and that is essential for us right now. I hope, though, that we will continue to have Susan come occasionally for a sermon.

Our next move is to decide what we want so our Search Team can move forward in the right direction. That team has hit the ground running and has already organized a workshop with a district representative to help us decide exactly what kind of minister we want to search for. For those of you who

could not attend the Town Hall meeting, Janine Larsen, our Pacific Northwest district executive, outlined for us possible options for the kind of minister we want. One would be a contracted minister, as both the Rev. Craig and the Rev. Cathy were. This is what Janine called a “steady dating” relationship with the congregation. Another is Settled/Called Ministry, which is more of a “marriage” between the minister and the congregation. It is meant to be a long-term relationship and as such would require more time to search and be sure she/he would be a good match for us. We discussed these options but did not choose one. That will be the goal of the upcoming workshop. Look for more information about the workshop below.

We have a GREAT Search Team working on our behalf. Join me in celebrating Steve Castles, Paul Blackburn, Debbie Olson, Don Hardin and Alicia Bhatta for their dedication to the fellowship during this huge endeavor. You five have my gratitude.
